The College / Management shall set apart the 50% of university quota (wherever it is applicable) in terms of the University regulations: Shall charge the fee structure prescribed by the University from time to time and shall not collect over and above the Fees / Amount stipulated by the University.
11. The rules and regulations and also the orders of the University published from time to time in respect of students of the college, faculty & non – teaching staff shall be enforced. The college shall not exceed the maximum of the intake prescribed in the affiliation notification





& shall not violate the eligibility criteria prescribed for admission of students to each course. If admissions of students are made in excess of the intake the affiliation will be cancelled.

16. The college shall not charge any kind of capitation fee.
17. Kannada should be used in the administration compulsorily.
18. The college shall submit the application for Renewal of Affiliation of the courses for the academic year 2018-19 without fail.
19. Principals will have to submit the list of eligible faculty members for the purpose of valuation to the board of examiners without fail. Failing which affiliation of the college will be withdrawn.

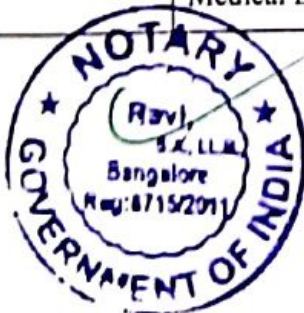

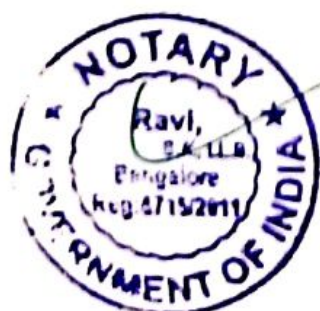
